In 2016, a total of \$28.4 million in premium was collected and \$46.9 million in claims paid out. We received \$9.7 million in risk adjustment, for a loss ratio of 130.7%. However, the rate increase of the product is driven partially by the combined Individual and Small group experience, which collected \$231.9 in premium and paid out \$215.4 million in claims. We received \$26.9 million in risk adjustment, for a loss ratio of 81.3%.
