6. The Notice To Show Cause sent to Respondent, directed him to appear before the Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking, Suite 701, 810 First Street, NE in Washington, D.C., on November 19, 2008 at 10:00 a.m.
7. After notice was duly given, a public hearing was held on November 19, 2008 for the purpose of determining whether the license of Respondent should be revoked.
9. The Respondent failed to appear at the Show Cause Hearing or have a representative appear on his behalf.
