

insurance producer license in another jurisdiction within thirty (30) days of the final disposition of the matter in violation of D.C. Official Code § 31-1131.17(a) for which the Commissioner may revoke your insurance producer's license pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 31-1131.12(a)(2)(2001).

7. The Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking (DISB) sent on October 20, 2008, via certified mail signed by Charlotte Parker, Assistant Attorney General, a Notice To Show Cause IB-SC-06-08, to Respondent Raytone A. Winslow, 6509 Old Branch Avenue, Apartment 202, Temple Hills, Maryland 20748.
8. The Notice To Show Cause sent to Respondent, directed him to appear before the Department of Insurance, Securities and Banking, Suite 701, 810 First Street, NE in Washington, D.C., on October 6, 2008 at 1:00 p.m.
9. After notice was duly given, a public hearing was held on October 6, 2008 for the purpose of determining whether the license of Respondent should be revoked.
9. The Respondent failed to appear at the Show Cause Hearing or have a representative appear on his behalf.

The evidence and testimony presented by Petitioner's counsel, Charlotte Parker reflected that due notice of the hearing and charges against Respondent was attempted to be served upon him at his last address of record and he failed to appear. Furthermore, the record also reflected that Respondent failed to remain licensed (his license was revoked by Maryland) and in good standing in his home state of Maryland and he failed to report to the Commissioner administrative action that was taken against his insurance producer license in Maryland within thirty days of the final disposition.
